

POSTGRADUATE MEDICAL (RESIDENCY) TRAINING

(Note: this option does not require enrolment at the University of Otago)

There are restrictions on the ability of foreign medical graduates to practice Medicine in New Zealand. Clinical medical practice in New Zealand requires formal registration with the licensing body, which has, like most countries, specific requirements for foreign graduates.

It may be possible to obtain temporary registration for a specific period to undertake supervised practice during residency training. Information on how to obtain temporary registration is available from the Medical Council of New Zealand, PO Box 11 649, Wellington, New Zealand (Website www.mcnz.org.nz).

Amongst other requirements, there is a major registration examination, the NZREX, which must be passed by foreign medical graduates before they can obtain employment to practice medicine without restriction.

Once you have temporary registration to practice medicine you can seek an approved training post as a House Surgeon or Registrar in a Health Services Hospital. POSTGRADUATE CLINICAL OR NON-CLINICAL STUDY

Please note that postgraduate clinical training is normally carried out in the context of having gained an approved training post in a New Zealand hospital and in association with the appropriate Royal College. While the University offers a number of clinically-based programmes, these are generally preparatory or complementary to the primary training provided in the hospital context. New Zealand medical registration is generally required for clinically-based programmes. Completion of a clinically-based programme does not assist you to gain New Zealand medical registration. The University also offers a number of non-clinical programmes in Medicine which do not require New Zealand medical registration.

Various programmes are offered in each of the Dunedin, Christchurch and Wellington Schools of Medicine. Distance programmes are taught generally within New Zealand only. International students cannot normally obtain student visas to study distance delivered programmes in New Zealand.

POSTGRADUATE STUDY FOR MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS – On Campus, This study only option does not give registration.

Post Graduate Diploma in Health Management (PGDipHealMgt)

A programme of study that draws equally on public health and business administration. Participants study health systems and health economics in the public health programme and a suite of recommended papers in business.

Masters of Health Sciences in Health Management (MHealMgt)

An advanced qualification in management, which includes a research component of either a supervised thesis or dissertation. It is suitable for students who wish to pursue a higher-level career in health management. It will provide evidence of in-depth, independent investigation into topics selected by students

Duration: 12 – 24 months

Entry Requirements: Have completed the Postgraduate Diploma in Health Management (PGDipHealMgt), or equivalent, and to

have achieved grades averaging B or better and have completed 30 points of postgraduate research methods

Post Graduate Diploma in Public Health (DPH)

It is relevant and practical, with graduates being able to identify and understand public health issues, and depending on which optional papers are taken, gain the skills to analyse and use health data, design appropriate health promotion strategies, plan and evaluate public health interventions, work collaboratively with professionals and the community, appreciate resource allocation and cost issues in health and uphold ethical standards

Duration: 12 months

Entry Requirements: Degree, diploma, or professional qualification, which would normally equate to a B average overall.

APPLICATION TO OTAGO

- Applicants must complete an online application via eVision. Application information is contained in the University's International Prospectus
 or from the University's website,
- The 2020 tuition fees for postgraduate medical programmes are generally NZ\$41,452 per annum. Approx 19.3 lakh
- 2019 Living expenses may amount to NZ\$17,000-\$20,000 per annum. Approx 7.4 9.3 lakh
- English language: evidence of English language proficiency is required if English is not the applicant's first language (TOEFL iBT score of 95 (writing 22); 6.5 in IELTS (no individual band below 6.0) ** IELTS 7.5 for Public Health)
