

CLINICAL PROGRAMMES

Clinically based courses are either two-semester (one year) or three-semester (one and a half years) programmes. All candidates need to have the following:

- a relevant bachelor's degree in Physiotherapy (Indian applicants must have achieved a 65% grade average)
- one year's full-time relevant clinical work experience after graduation and internship.
- special purpose scope of practice registration for postgraduate students with the Physiotherapy Board of New Zealand. This is restricted to a university course and limited to the duration of the course.

NOTE: Graduating with a Postgraduate Diploma or Master of Physiotherapy from the University of Otago does not enable registration as a physiotherapist in New Zealand. Further, a bachelor's qualification in physiotherapy from India will not be recognized for full registration in New Zealand.

APPLICATION TO OTAGO

- Physiotherapy candidates can apply online through the University's website, www.otago.ac.nz/international
- The 2020 annual tuition for Postgraduate Physiotherapy programmes is NZ\$41,452 (Approx) 19 Lakh. Living expenses may amount to NZ\$15,000-NZ\$18,000 per year.
- The academic year is end of February to mid-November.
- English language: evidence of English language proficiency is required if English is not the applicant's first language (IELTS score of 6.5 with no individual band below 6.0; TOEFL iBT score of 95 with a writing score of 22).

REGISTRATION

- Applicants require special purpose scope of practice registration for postgraduate students with the Physiotherapy Board of New Zealand, which is restricted to a university course and limited to the duration of the course.

Applications for special purpose scope of practice registration must be made directly to the Physiotherapy Board. This process should be started as soon as an Otago Offer of Place has been obtained. Physiotherapy students will need to supply the following material in support of their application for registration with the Physiotherapy Board:

- The application form obtained from the Physiotherapy Board of New Zealand which includes a statutory declaration of their intention to be a temporary resident, solely for the purposes of study towards a higher degree at the University of Otago.
- Evidence of current registration as a physiotherapist from their local registration authority.
- A certificate of good standing or letter from their local registration authority stating they are of good standing in the profession.
- CV

Proof of gaining special purpose scope of practice registration must be produced before a student can commence the relevant programme at the University of Otago. All documentation that is submitted must be translated into English and acknowledged as an accurate translation by an official, certified translator.
